Today at 11:00 CCPOA was in Alameda Superior Court for our TRO hearing regarding the new round of furloughs. As we were assigned to be heard in Judge Roesch's Court, the State exercised an objection and our case was assigned to another judge.

At 2pm we had our case heard. During the hearing the State represented to the Court that the memo suspending tomorrows furlough DOES apply to Unit 6. As such, the court remanded our TRO request to Judge Brick to be heard along with the other cases already in front of him. We will be back in court Wednesday August 18 in front of Judge Brick.

Subject: **FURLOUGH UPDATE**

At this time we recognize that CDCR employees need current information as to whether the Furlough Program will be in affect on Friday, August 13, 2010. The superior court order has suspended the Furlough Program. And, in the absence of a ruling from the First District Court of Appeal regarding whether the Furlough Program is suspended or not, at the present time the Furlough Program is suspended and Friday, August 13, 2010, will be a regular work day. If the situation changes today, we will advise you immediately and provide appropriate direction.

Managers and supervisors are directed to work closely with staff to approve leave requests for Friday, August 13, 2010, to accommodate staff who have made alternative plans in anticipation of Friday being a furlough day.

As we cannot predict the timing or outcome of the appellate court's review, we are not able to provide direction at this point for next week. I recognize this creates frustration, and so I thank you once again for your continued patience. You will be provided with information as soon as it becomes available so you can plan your work schedules.
