As you know, and has been discussed with the California Correctional Peace Officers Association (CCPOA), changes consistent with AB 109 and related legislation are rolling out. As we have also discussed, the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR) will be sending you notices of such changes consistent with the parties' Memorandum of Understanding (MOU). It is our hope and intent that the parties will continue to have significant communication during the roll-out of the changes.

The purpose of this realignment notice is to inform CCPOA that effective January 2012, CDCR Division of Adult Institutions (DAI) will, as a result of the realignment of inmates, convert 85 Reception Center (RC) beds to 68 Security Housing Unit (SHU) beds at California Institution for Women (CIW).

We are currently assembling documents and information relevant to this notice (e.g. Post Orders, revised Operational Procedures, Staffing Packages and etc.) and will provide these documents to CCPOA once they are complete. We, however, did not want to delay sending this notice to CCPOA.
